Hear directly from youth who are actively engaged in advising decision makers at the state and local level about pressing policy issues that affect young people, including healthcare, education, nutrition, foster care, homelessness, and juvenile justice. A growing number of Governors, State Legislatures, Mayors, City Councils, and County Commissions across the country have demonstrated success in engaging young people through Youth Councils: officially sanctioned groups of young people with a diverse range of life experiences who directly advise policymakers on policies and programs that directly impact youth.

Youth Council panelists will discuss:

- opportunities for incorporating youth voice in policymaking at the federal level;
- how federal policymakers can connect with existing state and local Youth Councils in their district;
- how effective state and local models for youth engagement in policymaking can be supported at the federal level.

This event is organized by **America's Youth Council Network** (supported by the Ready by 21 National Partnership), which brings together state and local Youth Councils from across the country to share best practices and promote the growth of the Youth Council movement.
