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What are some challenges to collecting good data?

8 responses

Consistent measures

Attendance/ability to reach everyone

students not fully understanding the questions

Completing surveys

Varied responses due to different views or understanding.

Getting stakeholders to complete them

Sending a reminder to parents ahead of time to plan accordingly during pick up because they will be doing surveys.

getting parents to complete surveys














Optimal Characteristics of Performance Data



- Relevant- directly related to overall goals and objectives of an initiative.
- Valid- data measures what it is intended to assess.
- Actionable- insightful and can be used to make decisions and corrections.
- Multi-level- designed for use by individuals (staff/sites) and aggregated across an organization/system to assess collective performance.

- Full scan of essential components that make up a high-quality youth development program
- Opportunity to compare feedback from key stakeholders
- Actionable information to support decision making and improvement planning conversations
- Common data points to tell a community impact story

Available in English and Spanish


Family Survey

Who should complete the family survey?

All parents/caregivers of students in the program.

What kinds of questions will be asked?

Our family survey is aligned to best practices in family engagement and aligns to the Weikart Center's pyramid of program quality.

How long will it take to complete?

The survey should take no more than 10 minutes to complete.





Families shape the afterschool program.

ENGAGING ENVIRONMENT

Expands social network for families.

INTERACTIVE ENVIRONMENT

Promotes skill-building and resource distribution for family members.

SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

Welcoming, safe space for families.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT





- Parents/caregivers that have more than one child in the program only need to fill out <u>one</u> survey for the child who has participated in the program the longest.
- Please remind parents/caregivers that survey responses are anonymous, and all of the data will remain confidential.
- It is also important to give the parent/caregiver sufficient privacy when completing the survey to ensure the confidentiality of their responses.







- Talk to parents/caregivers about the purpose and importance of the survey during your regular family engagement efforts, calls, visits, and/or daily interactions. Stress that their input is needed to make the program as beneficial as possible for their child(ren).
- Plan to utilize any time the parents are physically at the location.
- Share the WiFi password at your location or set up a hot spot.
- Put link to the survey on your program's social media pages.

Director & Staff Survey



What are your experiences as directors and staff that lead 21st CCLC programs?

96%

of surveyed AR 21st CCLC directors indicated helping young people to be successful in school is a priority in their program.





88%

of surveyed AR 21st CCLC staff indicated they are encouraged by their supervisor to innovate and try new ideas.



Director and Staff Survey



Who should complete the survey?

All program staff and directors: afterschool teachers, youth workers, site coordinators, etc.

What kinds of questions are on the survey?

Staff and directors report on job satisfaction, communication, academic activities, staff capacity, recruitment, connections to the school day, and community engagement.

How much time will it take?

The survey will take about 20 minutes.





Director and Staff Survey Best Practices

- Set time aside at a staff meeting for your team to complete the survey.
- Create a schedule for staff to use the computer on site to submit their responses.
- Remind your team that all voices matter (staff, students, and family/parents).

Student Survey



What are the experiences of students that attend your 21st CCLC program?

53%

of surveyed students indicated the activities they do in their 21st CCLC program make them think.





94%

of surveyed students generally agreed they like the activities in their 21st CCLC program.





Who should complete the survey?

Students in 4th through 12th grade who attend an AR 21st CCLC program.

What kinds of questions will be on the survey?

Students report their program experience, program satisfaction, skill development, and academic habits.

How long will it take to complete?

The survey will take about 10-15 minutes to complete.

Surveys **should not** be administered to students who have returned a "*Passive Consent*" form signed by their parent/legal guardian.



Student Survey Best Practices



- Decide how and when the survey will be administered (e.g., individually, as a group, etc.).
 Strategy should:
 - maximize student participation
 - minimize disruption to program schedule
- Read provided introductory script for all students being surveyed.
 - For grades 4 8: Read survey script (*see handbook and student survey)
 - For grades 9 12: Students can complete on their own
 - Use your best judgement in mixed-age settings
- Students should not talk to one another during the survey.
- If a student does not understand a word, offer an easier word, tell them to answer as best as they can, or remind them they can skip the question.
- Check in with students to ensure that they submitted the survey.



Engagement in Learning Teacher Report



Engagement in Learning



- One of five Government Performance Results Act (GPRA) performance measures
- Purpose is to get teacher feedback on student engagement in learning.
- Focus is on students in grades 1 5.
- Six questions in total that cover core engagement behaviors in the classroom.

Survey Administration Timeline



All surveys are to be completed by Friday, April 4th

Family: February 17th – April 4th, 2025

Staff and Director: February 17th – April 4th, 2025

Student: February 17th – April 4th, 2025

Teacher: February 17th – April 4th, 2025





- Weekly reports will be emailed with a count by site of surveys completed.
- Allows you to track your progress within the survey administration window.
- First audit will be emailed the week of February 24th.

Quick Reminders

- Student surveys are only for grades 4 – 12.
- Reports from teachers are only for grades 1-5.
- Survey links for directors, staff, and families will be sent to your email along with the guide, consent form, teacher materials, etc.
- Student survey and teacher report links are set up in Cayen.
